Title: "What Do You See?"

Scripture Reading: Luke 19:1-10; Matthew 7:1-5; 2 Corinthians 7; Romans 12; Psalm 51 & 52

Reflection: Pastor Henry

When you look at other people, what do you see? When you look at the other students on the class list in your homeroom this year, what do you see? When you look at the people who live in your neighborhood and the different neighborhoods within our city, what do you see? Do you see a sinner? Or do you see a son/daughter?

In our story for this week, on his way through Jericho, Jesus encounters Zacchaeus, a chief tax collector. The story of Zacchaeus is all about "seeing." It is a story about what we see and what Jesus sees. It is a story about how we see, what we see, and what we might not want to see.

As you read the story for today, did you see how many times the verbs 'to see' and 'to look' are used directly and indirectly in these verses?

Reread Luke 19:1-10 again in each of the different versions. As you reread, see what you see.
