Write them down below and/or share them with those who are with you.

# Respond / Reflect:

How are you becoming fluent in Kingdom-of-God language (the teaching of Jesus)?

How would the world be different if everyone lived into these Kingdom qualities described in the Beatitudes?

Who in your life exemplifies these Kingdom qualities described in the Beatitudes?

Which of the aspects of kingdom living, as Jesus describes in the Beatitudes, do you struggle with the most? The least?

How do you feel about the Beatitudes being an 'all-in-one' package for followers of Jesus and not a list from which a disciple can pick and choose?

How would you define the word blessed? How is being blessed different from being happy?

How should we go about using the word blessed as followers of Jesus?

# "Try It!"
